#### Self-help Program

The Compassionate Friends, Inc. is a mutual assistance, self- help organization offering friendship, understanding, and hope to bereaved families. Anyone who has experienced the death of a child of any age, from any cause is welcome. Our meetings give parents an opportunity to talk about their child and about their feelings as they go through the grieving process. There is no religious affiliation. There are no membership dues. The purpose of this support group is not to focus on the cause of death or the age of the child, as it is to focus on being a bereaved parent, along with the feelings and issues that evolve around the death experience of a child.

Coming to the first meeting is the hardest, but you have nothing to lose and everything to gain!. Try not to judge your first meeting as to whether or not The Compassionate Friends will work for you. At the next meeting you may find just the right person or just the right words said that will help you in your grief work.

What you say at our meetings is kept in the meeting, you can cry, hug, talk about how you are feeling freely. Our meetings are for parents, grandparents and siblings in grade 9 or above and adult siblings.

My name is Michelle Larrabee/Argue. I am organizing the 5th annual Hunter's Birthday Auction online. I am looking to raise money for Quakertown Midget Football Association and Quakertown Youth Baseball Association. Even though we were only apart of these organizations for a short time we immediately felt like it was our home. When Hunter passed they did not skip a beat to help me in the most tragic time.

Hunter passed away in July 2017 at the age of 10 due to a tragic UTV accident during a vacation in Texas. He was flown to the closest Children's Pediatric Unit which was in Shreveport, Louisiana where he

became an Organ Donor. Hunter's Birthday Auction was started in March of 2018 to celebrate his 11th Birthday. The first year, 2018, we raised \$2,100. Of that, \$1,600 went to 32 "Honor a Donor Family" packages and \$500 went directly to the Louisiana Organ Procurement Agency's (LOPA). The Second year, 2019, we raised \$3,262 of which \$2,500 of that went to a memorial bench, in Hunter's honor, in LOPA's new memorial park and \$762 was donated directly to LOPA. The Third year, 2020, we raised \$4,239 which went to The Compassionate Friends Quakertown Chapter. Last year, 2021, we raised \$4,365 which went to Home At Last Dog Rescue.

## The Season Of Spring And Grief

For those of us who are grieving, the season of Spring can bring about a lot of deep emotions. Spring is a sign of new things and growth. The flowers are emerging from the ground and the people around you are excited about the upcoming warm weather and enjoying fun with their families. The combination of theses things can give the bereaved a strong sense of loss and loneliness.

In our hearts, we are wishing we could share the bright new days ahead with our loved ones. We know that we will miss them when those days finally arrive. It is the dread of what feelings will arise, compounded by the excitement of others, that can throw a person who is grieving into a reclusive state. Easter and Mother's Day can be especially difficult. If these holidays are weighing heavy on your mind, think of a new tradition you can include on those days to honor and remember your loved one, such as planting flowers in their memory.



If you find yourself feeling like you want to be alone and you are not leaving your house, you may be showing signs of depression. Many of us choose to be alone during grief, especially for ones who are in the beginning stages. When the sun is shining, at least take yourself outside for a nice walk. You can even go to a park and walk on a trail or just sit on a bench and read or write in your journal. The sun will be good for you, as well as the fresh air.

We all need the time to process what he have lost and gone through. Be gentle on yourself during this season. Don't hesitate to reach out to others in local or online support groups that can relate to the feelings you are having. Grief counseling can also be of great help during these rough times when we are prone to feeling a stronger sense of loss.

# Special Announcement about Garden Plaques

Have you been considering a plaque to remember your child, sibling, or grandchild? Now is the time.

Our chapter broke ground for our memorial garden in April 2017. As we approach the 5 year mark, we continue to accept plaque orders which are then added to the garden wall by summer.

HOWEVER, due to a huge price increase starting March 12th, this is your final chance to order a plaque for \$135. This is a hard deadline of March 11, 2022 - order and money must be received by that date.

The order form is <u>found here</u>. On the form, you will have 2 options to pay: send a picture of the check and mail it to be received by March 11 OR bring the check to the meeting on March 8 (meeting at 7-8:30pm at the Gathering Place).

Once you submit the plaque, you will receive emails to confirm/verify the proof. If we do not have your money by March 11th, the plaque will not be ordered.






### **LOVE GIFTS**
